#### 300 sold = \$3,000 profit

Our Club's 15-Week raffle has proven to be a successful fundraiser. What makes it unique is that a person who purchases a ticket is eligible for each of the 45 prizes drawn (three prizes a week for 15 weeks starting Jan. 18). It has happened several times that an individual has won more than once.

That can be a prime selling point for members in their push to reach our goal of 300 tickets sold, which will realize a profit of \$3,000 for scholarships and other community activities for kids.
