Bill is Our Leader -

BILL BERTAKIS is Our Club's new leader for the 2007-2008 Optimist Year, succeeding ED SIMONS who held the post for the past two years. Bill was formally installed – along with a slate of other officers and directors (see box at the right) – at the Sept. 26 installation dinner at Gino's.

A resident of Keego Harbor since 1977, Bill explained why the Optimist Club is important to him: "When I see a kid, I want that kid to have every opportunity possible."

An automotive engineer by profession and professional photographer by avocation, in his remarks at the dinner, Bill said that membership recruitment, marketing optimism in the community, and sponsoring more events and programs were among his goals.

He and PAUL LIPSON were recognized recently by the West Bloomfield Board of Education for their co-leadership in developing a mentoring program involving students from Abbott Middle and Roosevelt Elementary schools.

Bill is the 34th individual to hold the presidential post since the Our Club's founding in 1973.

Air traffic safety expert to speak at initial recruitment meeting

The first of a series of membership recruitment meetings will be held Wednesday, Oct. 24, at Coach's Olympia Grill (located in a strip mall on Cass Lake Road at the intersection of Cass-Elizabeth Road). The program will begin at 6:30 p.m.

President BILL BERTAKIS has lined up Jim Holtsclaw as the speaker. He has a wide background in air traffic control and the use of radar in the nation's airports. He was the manager of air traffic at Detroit's Metro Airport and in Ontario, Calif.

Holtsclaw managed the Los Angeles air traffic tower during the 1986 Olympics. He is retired but serves as the executive director of the Society of Airway Pioneers.

Bertakis said he wants to use the evening meetings as a way of introducing the Optimists to the community. Members are encouraged to attend; however, these meetings are not intended to be an alternative to Our Club's regular Wednesday morning meetings.

Bertakis has arranged for Jack Reynaert, Henry Ford II's personal travel manager for 20 years, to speak at the recruitment meeting in November. The exact date will be announced.

"remarkable turnaround" in the past couple of years. Whereas in 2005 Keego was "running out of money," its most recent audit shows a general fund balance of \$479 million – "and it's going up."
